Knowth, Ireland Knowth is a neolithic passage grave and monument located in the Boyne River Valley in Ireland. Located in the date between 2500 and 2000 BC. View of the Eastern Pass, Knowth, Ireland: The east-west orientation of passages in knowledge suggests astronomic alignment with the equines. In addition, the monument contains three recesses and basin stones in which the cremated remains of the dead were placed. The right recess is larger and more elaborately decorated than others, a typical trait of Irish passing graves. The reason, however, remains unknown. Many monuments in assembled megalotal threesomes and archaeons speculate that most have religious meaning.
